

These Bylaws have been amended from their original version and passed by two-thirds of the membership present at a club meeting this 22 ND DAY OF JULY IN THE YEAR 2009.

- I. Name: Eutawville Flyers Radio Control Model Aircraft Club

- II. Objectives:
 - A. To promote and encourage the sport of radio control model aircraft in our community and to acquire and maintain suitable flying fields for model aircraft operations in accordance with the rules prescribed by the Academy of Model Aeronautics.
 - B. To establish guidelines for the safe operation of model aircraft and equipment
 - C. To provide instruction and R/C flight training and qualification guidelines.

- III. Membership:
 - A. All members except honorary members must be members of the Academy of Model Aeronautics.
 - B. Regular membership is open to all persons 18 years of age.
 - C. Junior membership is open to all persons 12-17 years of age.
 - D. A Special Lifetime membership may be awarded to a member who has distinguished himself in service to the club and the sport of R/C flying.
 - E. A person may be given honorary membership by a 2/3 vote of members present. Honorary members have full club privileges and may fly with AMA membership.
 - F. Any member who ceases to have the qualifications necessary for membership in the AMA will be terminated from the Club. Such termination is subject to reinstatement upon restoration of eligibility.
 - G. Any member who willfully or repeatedly violates Safety Rules that are related to flying activities or any other unacceptable behavior as deemed by three Club Officers may be expelled from the Club. Expulsion requires a two-thirds majority vote of the membership present after notification at the prior meeting. Any member who willfully commits any act or omission which is a violation of any of the terms of these Bylaws, or the Rules of the AMA, or which is detrimental to the Club, the AMA, or to model aviation is subject to this provision.
 - H. A two-thirds vote of the membership is required for reinstatement to the Club.

- IV. Dues and Fees:
 - A. All new members except honorary members will be assessed an initiation fee.
 - 1. Regular adult member \$50.00
 - 2. Junior member \$10.00
 - B. Membership annual dues.
 - 1. Regular adult member \$84.00 per year.
 - 2. Junior member \$20.00 per year.
 - C. Immediate family members (spouse, son, daughter, parent) residing in the household of a full paying member may be inducted into the Club at a 50% reduction of dues. Initiation fee waved.
 - D. New members' dues will be pro-rated through December.
 - E. Dues must be paid in full by the January meeting. Flying privileges will be suspended at that time if dues are not paid. If the dues are not paid by February 28, the member will be terminated and dropped from the roster.
 - F. A terminated member may be reinstated upon approval of the Membership Committee and upon payment of another Initiation Fee.

- V. Club Officers:
 - A. President
 - B. Vice President
 - C. Secretary
 - D. Treasurer

- VI. Elections:
 - A. Club Officers will be elected to one-year terms by a majority vote. Officers may be re-elected to one or more consecutive terms.
 - B. Candidates for election must be adult members in good standing and must be nominated and Seconded by members in good standing.
 - C. Nominations for Officers will occur at the November meeting. The election will be held at the December meeting. The nominees will be voted on by the members present at the meeting. Voting may be by a show of hands or by secret ballot decided by the members present.
 - D. New Officers' terms begin on the first day of February.
 - E. Any Officer may be impeached and caused to relinquish his office due to gross misconduct or failure to serve and attend meetings or activities only upon a vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular meeting following due notice and publication.

- VII. Club Organization:
 - A. The Club will hold regular monthly meetings. The dates and location to be set by the membership.
 - B. The club officers may meet in closed Executive Session as necessary to discuss personnel problems. Executive Session meetings for the purpose of normal planning and routine business will be open to all interested members.
 - C. All regular meetings will be conducted in a democratic manner utilizing "Robert's Rules of Order" as a GUIDE to the conduct of the proceedings.
 - D. The President will preside and maintain order during all regular meetings.
 - E. Regular Meeting Format:
 - 1. Call to order
 - 2. Introduction of visitors and guests
 - 3. Reading of minutes of previous meeting by the Secretary
 - 4. Treasurer's report
 - 5. Special announcements
 - 6. Committee reports
 - 7. Old business
 - 8. New business
 - 9. Activity/Demonstration Programs or Reports
 - 10. President's final remarks and Closing.
 - F. Committees:
 - 1. In order to provide for the smooth and orderly operation the Club, the President may Appoint two or more members to serve on the following committees or other committees not mentioned as deemed necessary by the President.
 - a. Membership Committee
 - b. Safety Committee (submits safety rules for membership approval and investigate crashes and mishaps. Report findings to membership for educational purposes)
 - c. Pilot Training and Certification Committee.
 - d. R/C Frequency Control Committee (maintain frequency board and related matters)
 - e. Program Committee (demonstrations, speakers, movies, instruction)
 - f. Fund Raising/Finance Committee

- VIII. R/C Pilot Training and Certification Program:
- A. In order to prevent personal injuries to the public and club members, and to Prevent damage to model aircraft and other personal property; all club members are encouraged to improve their R/C flying skills by taking part in the club's Pilot Training, Qualification and Certification Programs.
 - B. All flying club members will be certified and assigned to one of the following Classifications according to skill level:
 - 1. Student flier
 - 2. Novice Pilot
 - 3. Sport Pilot
 - 4. Expert Pilot
 - C. R/C Pilot Training and Certification will be under the guidance and control of the R/C Pilot Training and Certification Committee and pilots will be certified According to the standards set forth in the Club's" Student Training Lesson Plan" and "Pilot Proficiency Standards" guide.
 - D. Club Pilot Instructors will be nominated by the President and approved by the Membership. Two instructors and two club officers will form the Training and Certification committee.
 - E. Club members are encouraged to seek assistance from Instructors and Pilots Above their own skill level to achieve the next level of proficiency.
- IX. Club Flying Field:
- A. In order to insure that all pilots have adequate training and liability insurance coverage, the use of the Club's flying field shall be limited to active Eutawville Flyers Club members and AMA card holding guest only. Guests will be limited to three visits. Members bringing guests will be responsible for their actions.
 - B. To preserve good relations in the community with our neighbors, all engines over .15cc shall be equipped with an effective muffler.
 - C. All club members shall endeavor to protect the property of the owner's flying fields.
 - . Being especially alert to litter and refuse control and the prevention of grass fires.
 - D. Pilots shall control their aircraft in such a manner so as not to endanger other pilots, spectators or the public at large. Flying over the pit or spectator areas, or wanton recklessness is strictly prohibited and shall be grounds for immediate loss of field privileges.
 - 2. The Club Safety Committee shall be responsible for setting other guidelines and presenting them for membership approval.
 - E. Grass Cutting:
 - 1. All physically able Club members shall assist in mowing the flying field Grass.
 - 2. Two members will be assigned to cut the grass each week as per a published Schedule during the high growth season.
 - 3. The club may, by a vote of the majority of members at a regular scheduled meeting, contract with an individual or company to mow the grass on the fields . If this is done the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 or this section are Waived while such a contract is in effect.

- X. Amendments To The Bylaws:
 - A. The Club Bylaws may be amended by two-thirds vote of members present at a regular scheduled meeting following a published announcement of the proposed change. (Example: An amendment to the by laws is made by a Motion, then published and mailed to all active members. At the next regular meeting the amendment is voted on. It must be carried by two-thirds vote of the members present.

- XI. President's Discretion:
 - A. In order to handle the day-to-day business of the Club, the President is authorized to decide matters as he sees fit including matters not covered in these Bylaws.
 - B. The President will report all pertinent matters to the members at the following club meeting.
 - C. The President is permitted to spend up to \$200.00 two times in the year without a vote from the members providing he notifies another officer of his intentions.
